~~Sunday, April 22, 2007~~; rain or shine: ALL CITY RALLY XXVII by Corvettes de Olympia's 27th Annual Running of this 65-75 mile cruising type gimmick rally in the Olympia, WA area. Open to all cars and clubs; Miata teams are welcome and have participated in the last few years.

In a gimmick rally, cars with driver and navigator follow a complicated course around a route of back roads and answer questions about obscure things they see along the way. The finish is typically at a food and drink establishment, where everyone "rallies" and teams that get the most answers right win prizes, a sort of motorized scavenger hunt.

All the roads are paved, but it is NOT a speed event. There will be trophies for the top teams, dash plaques for all cars and a huge raffle of door prizes at the finish. Proof of insurance will be required (put the current card in the car now!) and there will be a brief tech inspection at the start (lights, signals, etc.). Entry fee is \$15.00 per car with all the proceeds going to the Corvettes de Olympia scholarship fund for automotive students at the South Puget Sound Community College.

Useful things to bring: your Miata with driver and navigator, clipboard or similar with paper to write on, pencils with erasers, maps of the Olympia area (they might come in handy!), binoculars to help spot obscure clues and gimmicks and a good sense of humor is mandatory.

First rally car out at 9:00 AM; last car must start before noon.

Injectors vs Crap Gas

If you are experiencing misfire, rough idle, stumbling on acceleration, hesitation or loss of power, it could be due to dirty fuel injectors. Last month we talked about the use of in-tank concentrated injector cleaners as a solution for minor blockage. Concentrated injector cleaner is more expensive than shelf stock cleaners, the kind you buy a box of at COSTCO. Unfortunately, this may not do the trick on really hard deposits. At that point it is time to consider either on-the-car direct cleaning or, in the really tough cases, injector removal for cleaning and or replacement.



In our shop, we have had good success with on-car cleaning. The process entails the shut down or looping of the fuel pump system and the substitution of a controlled input of cleaner. The car operates using the cleaner as its only source of fuel for approximately a half hour. All of the systems we have cleaned benefited from this method. Since the process we use requires regulated compressed air in a pressurized container, it may not be practical for you to try this yourself. The system shown in fig. 1 below uses aerosol type cans and, though we haven't used them, we have heard that they work well.

One of the side benefits to cleaning the injectors this way is that it cleans the valve seats and faces as well. On two cars we cleaned recently, the chronic ticking of the HLAs went completely away. It is our thinking that some HLA noise may result from carbonization not allowing the valves to close completely. If you have a better theory, please speak up.

The other option is to remove the injectors and have them cleaned. Why, you say, if the on-car method does the job? Three things: more thorough cleaning, verification of equal volume injector to injector and correct spray pattern. A flow tester (fig.2) measures the volume of fuel of all the injectors side by side. Weak injectors may be replaced or re-cleaned. Spray pattern is of equal importance. Even distribution of the fuel in the cylinder makes for a clean burn. Figure 3 shows a variety of spray variations on a test platform.

There is no argument that the removal of injectors for the purpose of cleaning them can be costly and time consuming. On top of that, it is recommended that you perform this service every five years or sooner if needed. The results, on the other

hand, may be worth it to someone looking for that little extra HP. Certainly, no matter what method you use cleaning them up will yield benefits and keeping them clean by running periodic cleaner additives in your tank will keep the cost to a minimum.
