

Directions to Cindy and Tom's @ 11908 215th PI SE, Snohomish: From North or Southbound I-405: take the Hwy 522 exit (exit 23) east to Wenatchee/Monroe. Stay on Hwy 522 until you come to the overpass (it will be after the light signals at Paradise Lake Road). Take the Fales/Echo Lake Road exit. At lights, turn right onto Echo Lake Road. Go about 1 mile and make left turn onto 215th PI SE at the Echo Wood Development (right after the big horse complex on the left and Quinn's Crossing on the right). We are the first house on the right; two-story yellow house with brown trim.

Spotlight on: Bob Bundy

Think you know Bob Bundy? Guess again! Here is everything you've ever wanted to know about a myriad of Miata and autosports topics, in Bob's own words.

How long have you owned your Miata?

I bought my 1990 Miata in 1993. My first car was more practical for me, a 1985 Mazda B2000 pickup, even though I wanted an RX7. At the time, my parents forced the issue and that is what I got. I had been without a car for a year after selling the truck to finish college. I had just got my undergraduate engineering degree and got a job 50 miles away so I needed reliable transportation. This time I wasn't going to be denied a sports car. Having been deeply involved in designing Formula SAE cars and other automotive engineering projects in college, I knew what I wanted. I wanted something that was rear wheel drive with a good suspension design. The list of cars at the time was quickly narrowed down and I had to have a Miata. I was very tempted by a turbo Toyota MR2 at a used car lot down the road. but the price was more than I could afford at the time. The Miata has been my sole transportation for most of the years since, but for some reason it's like a favorite childhood toy - only I never get sick of playing with it.

Describe your first time on the track.

I really started driving to be fast in the late 80's early 90's when I got into Formula SAE in college at the University of Texas at Arlington. Autocross was driver training for the national competition against about 100 other colleges at the time. The first really high speed stuff was done at a Porsche club road course in Mineral Wells, Texas. I really didn't start taking my Miata to the track until 2000 when I went to a weekday event at Bremerton (I can't remember if it was IRDC or the Alfa Club). That was fun, but what really got me hooked were real road courses like Pacific Raceways and Thunderhill. They are hilly and twisty and make you feel like you're really going somewhere.

What advice do you have for people who want to bring their Miata to the track?

Car Setup: You will need a good "roll bar", something equivalent to a Hard Dog Hard Core and preferably labeled as SCCA Solo1 approved. "Style Bars" aren't acceptable and some clubs are stickier than others about getting the top of your helmet 2" below the bar. The 2" rule can be hard to meet without some seating adjustment and/or modification for tall drivers. You also might want to upgrade brake pads to ones that can handle more heat than stock.

Driver Setup: Autocross is good practice for car handling but the higher speeds near the limits on the track can be intimidating even for experienced autocrossers. Most clubs that hold lapping days at Pacific Raceways will want you to participate at an event at Bremerton first or have taken a performance driving school at Pacific Raceways. Bremerton offers the high speed

experience with a little less danger. Several clubs and companies offer High Performance Driving schools, such as ProFormance, IRDC, and the Northwest Alfa Romeo club. These are great ways to get excellent one-to-one driver instruction with introduction to driving fast on a race track. The schools also offer classroom sessions that are very informative. I highly recommend attending one of the schools. Most all open track lapping events offer ride-along instructors to those that request them and require instruction for drivers new to the track until the instructor signs them off to go solo. Autocross experience generally helps on the track but for some reason the reverse isn't quite as true. I've seen experienced road racers have a really hard time with an autocross course.

Be prepared to get hooked: Entry fees are quite a bit more than autocross and at a track event you will be there all day. Unlike an autocross, though, you won't be required to stand around and chase cones while you're not driving. You can spend that time talking to friends, checking over your car, watching others drivers, etc. Also unlike autocross events where you spend three to five minutes actually driving during the day, you will typically get between two and three hours worth of on the track lapping, and lunch is provided. The long, sweeping high speed corners where you can set your car and feel the balance

for a long distance are exhilarating and hard to find anywhere else legally. Lapping days are not a competition event, they're just pure fun like a big theme park ride.

How would you describe autocross?

Autocross is challenging and really hard to do well. It's got as many or more turns and transitions as a full road course and they are all compressed into 1/4 the time frame. You have a very limited number of chances at a course to learn it and small mistakes cost your lap time dearly. The competition is fun but knowing the mistakes you made can make it quite frustrating at times.

How long have you been autocrossing?

My first autocross was in 1989. I did it off and on until 1994, at which point mountain bike racing sort of took over my life and weekends. An injury brought me back to playing with cars in 2001.

What do you consider to be the most valuable driving skills you have learned at the track and autocross?

Using more throttle and less brakes makes you faster. As I improve, I find I can use the brakes less and transition more quickly to balancing the car in a corner with the throttle and gradually roll on more throttle earlier as I exit a turn.

Is there anything else you would like to add?

As further proof of my Mazda illness, my spare car happens to be a 1988 Mazda 323 GTX all wheel drive turbo.

The Database Coordinator needs to work well with the Sounder Editor, Communications Officer and Web Committee.


