This summer marked the first time the PSMC made an appearance at the annual Marysville Strawberry Days Parade June 21. Just three cars showed up for this exciting and long parade, which requires every entry to have lights since it takes place in the evening around dusk. # Coop's Corner

# Which oil is the best for your car?

(This article is condensed from the website www.streetcommodores.com, where you can read the full text of this material, which was written by Ben Nightengale).

Ever wonder which motor oil is the best for your car? With so many to choose from and in so many weights and grades, it can be a confusing choice for many drivers. But in an unusual experiment, Street Commodores conducted tests of a number of different motor oils to figure out which is the best oil for the best price and does the best job.

To conduct the experiment, SC purchased one of everything off the local store shelves. Next, they tested the film strength properties of lubricating fluids. They used a lubricant testing machine developed by a company called Timken, which developed the Timpken OK Load--the maximum load in pounds a lubricant could withstand without failure due to breakdown of the lubricant film. To overview, they just tested one specific attribute of the oils with the goal being to demonstrate long-term wear in a short period of time.



One thing the authors noted is that a number of additives come with that bottle of oil. The manufacturers of car oil are trying to provide a product that provides for longer service life and engine protection.

You will want to look for the API Certificate stamps on any oil you purchase. This starburst mark means the oil meets performance requirements set up by the auto manufacturing industry and the lubricant industry. The full text of the article gives a lot more detail and discussion about this stamp, so go read it on the website if you are interested in learning more.

The important thing is to look at some oils. Here's a brief recap of some representative results of testing (not all oils are discussed here):

- One oil that performed well for the money is the Pennzoil GT Permformance Semi-Synthetic 10W-40, at a cost of \$37.99 per quart. It was rated "pretty good for the price."
- Gulf Western Ultra 15W-50, at a cost of \$25.99, is a semisynthetic version of Protecta Multi Valve. The cheapest oil on the test, it had higher pressure resistance than some other oils and was the lowest in price.
- The Mobil 1 OW-40 is a fully synthetic oil formulated with a "patented SuperSyn anti-wear technology." For all its hype, this expensive oil (\$89.99) was outperformed by oils for half the price, and was outperformed by another Mobil product, the Synth S.
- Red Line Synthetic 5W-40, \$119.99 is advertised as a synthetic oil that is designed to bring the highest protection, cleanliness, and superior drain intervals with the lowest friction. This was the second most expensive oil tested, and it was not the best performer by any means. Extreme pressure properties were not as good as some of the much less expensive oils

- Shell Helix Plus Semi-Synthetic 1 5W50, \$26.99, was the second cheapest oil in the test and actually outperformed the more expensive Helix Ultra.
- Castrol Formula R OW-40, \$67.90, is a high-performance engine oil tested under race conditions. The manufacturer recommends it for sports cars and high performance engines. This

oil was a disappointment. The short answer is: it just didn't perform well.

- Valvoline Durablend 10W-40, \$41.99, is sold as a synthetic blend -based formula for higher performance than conventional oils and better value than full synthetics. This oil performed "far better than all of the other oils in a similar price point." It beat the majority of oils that were more expensive and was rated a good value for the money.
- Royal Purple 10W-40 Multigrade, \$79.99, is the only oil formulated with the Royal Purple proprietary 'Synerlec' technology, forming a tough lubricating film on all surfaces and proported to have superior wear

protection. This was the best-performing oil of all, leaving very little wear pattern in the test, and actually "micro-polished" the bearing. While it is not the least expensive, it showed impressive results so it is one oil that may be worth the money.

# Busy as an Autocrosser!

A busy autocrosser is a happy autocrosser. At least that's what I've heard. If that's the case, then we're a region of many happy autocrossers. This past month, there were autocrosses at Bremerton (once), Packwood (twice) and Tacoma (twice).

The June 22 event at Bremerton was hosted by BSCC. It was a HUGE event, with 199 entrants. I don't know if that's a record. In Sports S, *Tom Slipp* ('91 Miata), *TJ McGeary* ('91 Miata) and *Chris Halstead* ('89 RX-7) made it a 2-3-4 finish. *Dieter Beldi* ('07 MazdaSpeed 3) finished first in Large Sedan, and *John Kabigting* ('91 Miata) finished 13th in the large Street Tire class.

June 28 was SCCA ProSolo #2 at Packwood. There were 78 entrants at this hot (100+ degrees) event. Dieter Beldi ('07 MazdaSpeed 3) placed first in Stock 3. In SM2, Brett Wilson and Enrique Garcia drove Brett's '99 Miata to second and fifth place finishes respectively. Kudos for this event go to Dieter Beldi and Brett Wilson. Dieter had the ninth top indexed

time of the day, while Brett had the ninth top unindexed time of the day. Extra kudos go to *Dieter Beldi*, who won the overall ProSolo event!

SCCA #5 at Packwood on June 29 was hot hot! Yes, it was even hotter than the previous day's ProSolo. Shade was hard to come by (except in the awesome covered pits). Many of the 142 entrants opted to run in the morning group, figuring it would be cooler. The sole first place PSMC driver was Rich Blake, who won S2 in his '94 Miata. Dieter Beldi ('07 MazdaSpeed 3) placed second in S3, and Tim Irwin ('89 Porsche Carrara) placed fifth in NS1. In SM2, Bob Bundy ('90 Miata) placed second and Rickey Carlson ('90 Miata). in a rare appearance this year, placed third. OPAX was the most popular class for all drivers (including PSMC drivers) at this event. Glen Hernandez (Canadian '06 Lotus Elise) placed second, Brett Wilson ('99 Miata) placed 20th, and Enrique Garcia ('99 Miata) placed 29th. Kudos for the event go to Glen Hernandez, who had the second top indexed time of the day, as well as the ninth top unindexed time of the day.

Next up was a WWSCC double-header at Cheney Stadium in Tacoma, July 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup>. July 5<sup>th</sup> was the ACE Dogfight '08. Out of 83 entrants, there were five PSMC drivers, three of whom won their classes! *TJ McGeary* (IB), *Bob Bundy* (OS), and *Dieter Beldi* (SD) were the lucky winners. *Alan Dahl* ('07 Pontiac Solstice GXP) placed third in PRO1, and *John Kabigting* had fun in the Time Only class.

July 6 was the 33<sup>rd</sup> BEAC Autopilot. There were 107 entrants, including eight PSMC drivers. *TJ*, *Bob*, *Dieter*, and *Alan* placed exactly as they did the previous day: 1, 1, 1, 3. Joining in on the fun in the ST3 class were *Russ Hill* (3<sup>rd</sup>), and *John Kabigting* (5<sup>th</sup>), both in '91 Miatas. Having fun in the Time Only class were *Bob*, *Brett Wilson*, *Glen Hernandez*, and *John*. Kudos for the event go to *Bob Bundy* and *Alan Dahl*. Bob had the third and eight top unindexed times of the event, and Alan had the fifth top unindexed time of the event.

A new drive has been added to the PSMC calendar this year, scheduled for October 11at 1 p.m. If you have never taken the opportunity to visit one of the many corn mazes in the area during the fall harvest season, this is your chance to see what all the excitement is about and have some fun with your Miata friends too.

This drive will be hosted by Charlotte Fellers and Tom and Cindy Smith. Still in the planning stages, the starting point will most likely be someplace in the Renton area with a short drive to the Carpenito Brothers Corn Mazes in Kent. Directions to Coop's Miata: From the north: Take I-405 south to the Enumclaw/Renton Exit; go left at the second light, putting you on Maple Valley Highway (Hwy 169).
