

This will be a one-day back roads cruise at leisurely speed from Puyallup, USA, to Willamette Valley Miata Club's big Explore Oregon 2011 meet in Silverton, Oregon. We'll head south exploring newly-found two-lane blacktop east of I-5, then zig southwest to cross the Columbia River at Longview. After a brewpub-type lunch the route will revisit some favorite twisties (and a few new roads) in the hills of NW Oregon, finally cutting southeast across the Willamette Valley to Silverton. We'll arrive in time for the opening afternoon's socializing.

I wanted to write a journal/article for the Puget Sound Miata Club Sounder about our recent vacation to Costa Rica. I'm trying to look at this and write this article from the perspective of a Miata driver.

To start off there is one Costa Rican phrase that is ubiquitous and utilized for any and all occasions:

Pura Vida (pronounced Pu'da Vida) which when translated means Pure Life....This term is used in greetings, salutations, and in everyday conversations. You can't go wrong whenever or wherever you decide to "whip it out".....

My spousal unit (Vickie McGranaghan) is an employee with Delta Airlines at the SEATAC reservation office and as a bonus when Delta airlines bought out Northwest airlines, Delta had awarded all of its employee's two round trip dedicated airfares anywhere that Delta flies worldwide. That being said we had discussed several options on our dream sheet of where we'd like to vacation. I was thinking and leaning toward a visit to the Holy Land in the Middle East, Israel, Beirut, Syria, Cairo, culminating with a Medeterrian cruise from Barcelona, with stops in Italy, and Istanbul. However, after a lot of cussing and discussing Vickie made up my mind for me and decided on a 10 day visit to Costa Rica.

As always there's got to be some incident that when looked back upon strikes a funny cord.

you guessed it, San Juan, PR. It had my most important stuff in it, swimming suits, and most important was my travel itinerary, which contained my hotel itinerary, travel arrangements, and all that. You're probably thinking to yourself that why didn't that idiot have all that important stuff in his carry on....I did, however because the flight was completely full, my carry on was taken from me just prior to entering the aircraft to be stored in the baggage compartment, and consequently during the confusion and rush of boarding the plane, the gate agent accidentally entered the SJU code instead of the correct SJO code. - Costa Rica which means "rich coast", drawing more than a million tourists yearly.
- The flora and fauna is very similar to Hawaii
- The capital of San Jose is located approximately 9 degrees north of the equator.
- Dry season Nov thru Apr average mean temperature 72 degrees Fahrenheit

Red Wine, Chocolate and Whiskey a Good Combination

The tradition of a wine tour for Valentine's weekend featuring the addition of a stop at a boutique whiskey tasting room in Woodinville proved to be a winning combination for the 17 club members who attended this year's run.



Originally, the plan was to meet at Ruby's Diner in downtown Woodinville. It was open three weeks ago, but closed unexpectedly (at least for us!) so when we arrived there, we had to regroup and find a new breakfast place. After consulting online telephone books and several GPS devices, we headed toward a reputed Denny's Restaurant. When we arrived at the supposed address, it was a private home (probably owned by someone named "Denny."). That's how we ended up at Jack In The Box for a quick breakfast.

The first stop on the tour was the Tefft Winery, which featured four wines paired with four kinds of chocolate including an intriguing pumpkin-infused variety. This winery features several reds, mediums and whites for tastings. The next stop was at the Woodinville Whiskey Company for a brief overview of the distillery on-site and free tastings

of the two liquors made there. The first was an organic vodka, followed by an organic single malt whiskey. The whiskey had absolutely no color, but available for purchase was a miniature aging oak barrel kit, which came with instructions for those who wanted to age the whiskey in the barrel several weeks to create the amber color more familiar to most whiskey connoisseurs.

Next up was the Januik/Novelty Hill tasting room, just up the road from Tefft. This was a popular stop because of the limited appetizer-sized menu of hot food items for those who needed a food fix. Additionally, wines at Novelty Hill were paired with gourmet chocolate chip cookie samples. These cookies were heavy on the butter and sugar and also heavy on the taste.

The final stop was the always-popular Columbia Winery for a choice of several wines designed to please every palette. By this time, the day was getting away and because of work the next day, many chose to head on home. Those who wanted to continue the fun caravanned to the warehouse wine district in Woodinville for some additional tastings. All in all, it was a leisurely afternoon, giving all a chance have a relaxing afternoon socializing over some delicious wine and food.

- At the end of each sentence, use one space, not two. It saves space and most publications use this format; so do we.
- Send articles as an attachment; don't paste them into the email window. This creates an extra step for the editor, who already has a lot to do.
- If you send photos, send j-pegs. We have to "photoshop" them anyway for publication, so just send them straight from your digital camera.
- Send 3-5 photos, not 25-30. We need your BEST photos, not all of them.
- The deadline for the next month is the 15th of the current month.
- The event host is responsible for writing pre-run articles and finding a volunteer to write a post-run article. Always send photos too.
