sary to make your car safe for the application of additional power. Coop's suggests it as the most important and 1st step in modifying your vehicle. The Miata is built with uni-body construction meaning, quite simply, that it is flexible. Under high torque and extreme driving condition equalizing weight distribution and maintaining grip on the road go hand in hand. Removing flexibility and increasing footprint is of utmost importance for safe performance whether you are planning for more power or just want better control of your stock vehicle. FOCUS: Roll bars, Body stiffeners, Wheels and tires.

### B. Suspension/Chassis: "TRANSFERRING POWER TO THE ROAD"

This seminar will cover those steps you can take to reduce sway and lean and put your power where it belongs and under control. If you plan on keeping your tires in contact with the road surface under diverse road and track conditions you will need to modify the suspension system and lower the center of gravity. We will look at different equipment combinations designed for serious improvement whether you plan on competing or just want to improve handling. We will look at adjustable systems that can give you

smooth comfort for long drives and convert in minutes to track ready stiffness. FOCUS: Torsion bars and mounts, Adjustable shocks, Progressive and cut springs

### C. Normally aspirated improvements " MAKING GOOD BETTER"

This seminar will look at increasing horse power and improving torque using the basic normally aspirated engine. This will be a presentation of the least expensive way to create additional horsepower in your Miata: Improving the efficiency of air flow, Increasing exhaust flow, Advancing timing, Cooling the air charge, Reducing turbulence and other simple tricks to keep your engine operating at peak performance. "Best bang for your buck!" would sum it up. FOCUS: Exhaust systems, Air intakes, Finding cold air, Advancing timing, Tune up tricks

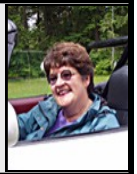
### D. Abnormal aspiration "RELEASE THE KRAKEN"

We will explore both turbocharger and supercharger installations. There are a variety of improvements that can improve power BUT nothing does it as well as forced induction. Unfortunately many installations don't meet expectations creating expensive unreliable performance. We will discuss criteria for the platform
