At last, spring is calling all Miata drivers to the annual Detailin' Day to get your cars buffed and shined up, ready for the summer driving weather that is (hopefully) just ahead. We'll commence the activities on May 5 at 10 a.m. (not a minute before).

Lee Johnson Mazda in Kirkland has offered their facilities to the club again this year as hosts for the event. Not only does the day provide all club members the chance to wash, vacuum, and buff their cars in preparation for summer driving, it also gives the folks at Lee Johnson some visibility to potential Miata owners who may want to consider owning one of these fabulous cars.

You can show up at 10 a.m. and start the process with washing your car (including under the hood if you choose) and vacuuming the inside. After that, you can get in line for the buffing station, and follow that with a final coat of wax to bring your baby to its finest shine. All [Meguiar's](#) cleaning

and polishing supplies will be provided; all you need to bring is some polishing cloths for the final steps and your own elbow grease.

As in the past, if a non-member wants to detail a car, cost will be \$20 (or they can just join the club for \$30).

We do have a need for some additional volunteer buffers this year. We have a contingent of buffers who have graciously agreed to do this job for many years but for various reasons, they are unable to contribute this year. So now is the time for a new generation of buffing experts to step up to the challenge. You can contact Mike Springer at springer-photo@wamail.net and he'll line you up with all the necessary tools and details to be a buffing rock star.

Lunch will be provided by the board in the form of homemade chili of varying kinds (including a gluten-free option) and hot dogs provided by the folks at Lee Johnson. We'll have some brownies and gluten-free cookies for dessert.

Once you finish detailing your car, plan to stay on hand until around 2 p.m. for the show-and-shine at the dealership. This is an essential component of our co-sponsorship with the folks at Lee Johnson Mazda, so don't plan to cut and run as soon as you finish up.

Trophies for 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place for each of the three generations of Miatas will be awarded to the most deserving cars so be sure to keep that in mind during your polishing and buffing sessions. The trophies are being donated by the fine folks at Lee Johnson, and we thank them very much for everything they are doing for you and the club.

PSMC again is hosting our overnigher run to WVMC's "Explore Oregon" meet in Ashland, and we will get there by using the twistiest and most scenic secondary roads. PSMC drivers will recognize some of our favorite roads, but we'll be introducing new roads as well this year. This run travels at leisurely "cruising speed," not "cornering on the door handles," and we make frequent stops when curious.

Weds. July 11: Meet at the Chevron station off the SE corner of Exit 81 (Mellen St.) from I-5 in Centralia, Wash. and leave at 9:00 AM. [If you're mapping it, specific location is: Mellen Street Freeway Market, 1232 Mellen Street, Centralia, WA 98531, (360) 736-3112.] We'll take the 2-lane blacktop into Oregon and have lunch near Forest Grove.

Six single king rooms are \$149; also two 2-queen rooms are available at same price, but they are handicap-accessible. The room block expires 30 days in advance (June 11th.) You may cancel without penalty up to 4:00 PM the day before arrival.

Thurs. July 12: After the hotel's continental breakfast we'll get out of town and find the back roads, and maybe some covered bridges, arriving in Ashland for the first evening's opening ceremonies of Explore Oregon. We may have to include a section of freeway this day to avoid some very long route-arounds.

The Society of Vintage Racing Enthusiasts (SOVREN) and the SOVREN Guild of Children's Hospital have announced the racing dates for the **24th Annual Pacific Northwest Historics** to be June 29th thru July 1st. The races will be held at Pacific Raceways, formerly Seattle International Raceway. All proceeds benefit uncompensated care at Children's Hospital and Regional Medical Center in Seattle. Over the last 13 years, almost \$3.5 million dollars have been raised at the race.

Our club will be in the "car corral" on Saturday June 30th and Sunday July 1st, giving us the opportunity to show our cars to the general public and take a few parade laps around the race-course during the lunch break intermission. There will be lots to see and the pits are open to the public.

There will be no one featured marque this year; Instead, all British sports and racing cars are featured. Just confirmed is the featured driver Johnny Rutherford, three-time Indy 500 winner.

The "Pacific Northwest Historics" features many of the world's rarest and most beautiful pre-1970 race cars. This year, more than 250 vintage racecars

are expected to enter. Favorites include Ferraris, Lotuses, Cobras, Corvettes, Porsches, Austin Healeys and some less recognizable names like Elva, Ginetta, and McLaren. Most are in mint condition through extensive restoration and many attain speeds in excess of 150 miles per hour. Some of the cars are valued at over \$1 million and many have impressive racing histories. Competitors come from all over the West Coast and Canada. The wheel-to-wheel competition on the challenging 2 ¼-mile road course includes nine turns, 200-300 foot elevation drop and a near ¾-mile straight-away.

Gates open at 8:30 a.m. The cost is \$30 per car and driver each day; passengers are also \$25 per day.

Passes for all three days are \$50 driver and car or passenger. Each club is limited to 20 cars per day; so the tickets will be on a first-come basis.

The deadline for ticket reservations will be June 1st. You will be sent the tickets in the mail before the event.

When you arrive you will be directed at the gate to the area the club will be in.

To make reservations send a check and completed ticket order form (made

out to Mike Springer) for the total amount, and enclose a stamped self addressed envelope. If you have an email address send it as well so I can acknowledge the receipt of your payment. Give me a call or better send an email if you have questions. The email version of the Sounder has a PDF version of the form to print (double-click to open). If you do not have access to a printer call me and I'll send you one.
