WVMC "EXPLORE OREGON" REVISITED By Dee & Duncan (in her 2019 orange "Zatarah")

The "Explore Oregon" weekend meet is put on every year by Willamette Valley Miata Club (http://www.oregonmx5.com) and each time it moves to a different destination in that state, drawing 80+ cars. Cruise in Thursday, welcome party that night, go on scenic drives etc. Friday and Saturday, big banquet Saturday night, go home Sunday. This year's meet was at the



mega Mount Hood Resort in the village of Welches, at the SW corner of Mt. Hood.

We hosted the traditional "Two Lanes To Oregon" run to get local club members from Puget Sound area to the meet via back roads, avoiding freeways. The drive started in Enumclaw to be at the outside edge of our local Urban Sprawl, but that meant everyone had to get *through* the sprawl at AM drive

time to be there. Ugh. Thence over Chinook Pass (5432 feet) to Yakima, had lunch at the classic Miner's Drive In, over Konnowac Pass Rd., then down US 97 past Hood River, with a pit stop at the yummy St. John's bakery (at a Greek orthodox monastery) for mid-afternoon dessert, 291 miles to the resort entrance.

Friday we went on the lavender and wine run, about 125 miles. Others opted for a drive to Oregon Raceway Park, a private no-spectators road-racing course, where they could take supervised familiarization laps en masse, not getting guite to racing speeds. We had done that at a previous meet. So our group wandered the best little "sports motoring" roads through a lavender farm and 4 wineries all along the Hood River Fruit Loop of agribusiness (they actually call it that, as a scenic drive for tourists.) Lunch was at Hood Crest Winery & Distillery. That meant we could have our favorite mushroom/herb/multicheese pizza there, all accompanied by the unique "Mr. Gray," their barn cat who greets everybody.


